

COME FOR A TOUR OF HISTORIC GURNET LIGHT – THE COUNTRY’S OLDEST OPERATING WOODEN LIGHTHOUSE

Join **Project Gurnet and Bug Lights** for a trip to historic Gurnet Light, the Keeper’s Cottage, and Fort Andrew at the end of Gurnet Point.

Your tour guides will help you relive the history of these American treasures.

Date: Saturday, May 25th, 2019

Where: Gurnet Light

When: 9:30 am to 2:30 pm

Shuttles will be leaving approximately every 30 minutes, starting at 9:00 am from the Duxbury Bay Maritime School, 457 Washington St, Duxbury, MA.

- Climb to the top of Gurnet Light and enjoy the vista of Massachusetts Bay. On a clear day, the view of Provincetown is breath-taking.
- Tour the Keeper’s Cottage and our collection of artifacts and antique pictures of both Gurnet Light and Bug Light.
- Learn about the Nation’s First Female Lighthouse Keeper—Hannah Thomas and her husband.
- Hear about the servicemen who served at the Fort during the Revolutionary War, the War of 1812, and the Civil War.
- Learn about Project Gurnet & Bug Light’s efforts to deal with the rapid erosion of Gurnet Point.
- Go back in time and tour the Lifesaving Station with much of its equipment in place as it was in 1920.
- Take our shuttle van, or if you have 4- or all wheel drive, you can drive yourself out, but there is limited parking!
- We ask everyone for a donation of \$5/person (max. \$20/family) to help us **“Keep the Lights Shining!”**
- Shuttles will be leaving the Duxbury Bay Maritime School (DBMS) starting at 9:00 AM. The last shuttle will leave Gurnet Light at 2:30 PM to return to DBMS.
